When she enrolled in a local art workshop near her home on Long Island, she began what was to become a long and distinguished career as a visual artist. From 1955 – 1959, she attended the Brooklyn Museum Art School where she studied with William Kienbusch and Rueben Tam. In 1962, she earned her Masters Degree at Pratt Institute.

Tam, whom she credited with defining her as an artist, introduced her to Monhegan Island, where she painted and maintained a studio every summer from the late 1950's until the present.

Over the course of her lengthy career, she exhibited her work in solo shows and juried exhibitions too numerous to mention. She was a charter member of the National Museum of Women in the Arts and belonged to the National Association of Women Artists from whom she received more than half a dozen prizes and medals of honor. She received a number of other awards and medals, including a Lifetime Achievement Award from Brooklyn College. Her paintings are held in collections worldwide and have been exhibited at the Portland Museum of Art, the Slater Memorial Museum in Norwich CT, and the University of Connecticut at Storrs, to name but a few. She served as a powerful role model for other female artists, mentoring many of them, and actively maintained a large and ever-growing network of friends and admirers. She lived independently and continued to work in her studios in Connecticut and Maine, and also to exhibit her work, until the end of her
